5. What are your overall comments and suggestions regarding EduWiki 2013?

Several few people took this as an opportunity to say thank you for the conference and say how useful it was. Two comments related to the timing of the conference, namely that summer would be less busy for potential attendees as opposed to the autumn term, and that the Saturday finished a bit late. Two others suggested that a wider range of participants would be useful, one suggesting that a more international audience should be targeted, while the other hoped for more students giving their opinions. Additional comments offered the point of view that more active chairing of Q&A sessions would have been conducive to discussion so that people weren't interrupting, and it was also suggested that the "walls of hope" could have been repositioned as workshops. Two people noted that better coffee would have been a boon.
